Maria elaborates further on the aspects that set Alpha apart, including "the state-of-the-art-technology, smartboards and iPads in every class. They teach Robotics and Computers." She is particularly pleased that language is a focus as all kids from kindergarten to eighth grade learn Spanish. "Another plus is the beautiful pool," Maria prizes, explaining that "from kindergarten through third grade, with a ratio of 4-to-1 teacher to student, they take swimming." Maria continues, "they have an excellent art teacher and an enthusiastic Phys. Ed. teacher, and participation in many competitive team sports. They have a beautiful playground for recess." As a mother and successful business-woman, Maria raves about all the fun social, family, religious, and intellectual activities that are always taking place at the school.
